

# Information for your bank or solicitor



**We recommend that you seek professional advice when making or changing your Will. You may find the following information useful when you visit your bank or solicitor.**

## **Suggested wording**

The wording below can be adapted to suit your particular needs and wishes.

### **Leaving a share of your estate to Brain Research Trust (a residuary legacy)**

"I give to Brain Research Trust of 15 Southampton Place, London WC1A 2AJ [all] [a...<sup>2</sup>... percentage or share]<sup>1</sup> of my residuary estate. I declare that the receipt of the Registrar or other authorised officer of Brain Research Trust shall be a good and sufficient discharge to my Executors."

### **Leaving a fixed sum of money (a pecuniary legacy)**

"I give to Brain Research Trust of 15 Southampton Place, London WC1A 2AJ the sum of [in words] pounds (£ [figure])<sup>2</sup>. I wish this legacy to be increased in accordance with the retail price index formula from the date of this my Will.]<sup>1</sup> I declare that the receipt of the Registrar or authorised officer of Brain Research Trust shall be a good and sufficient discharge to my Executors."

### **Ensuring spouse/civil partner is taken care of for their lifetime (a reversionary legacy)**

"I give my [ share in my]<sup>1</sup> main residence at my death to my Executors on trust for my wife/husband/civil partner during her/his lifetime and on her/his death to Brain Research Trust of 15 Southampton Place, London WC1A 2AJ.

"I give [all] [a...<sup>2</sup>...percentage or share] of my residuary estate to my Executors on trust for my wife/husband/civil partner during her/his lifetime and on her/his death to Brain Research Trust of 15 Southampton Place, London WC1A 2AJ. [It is my wish without creating a binding obligation to UCL that this gift is used for ... (your chosen area)]<sup>1</sup>."

NOTE: Where property ownership is shared, the status of joint tenancy will mean that the surviving owner automatically inherits the property regardless of any Will or expressed intentions. It is important to ascertain the status of ownership, e.g. tenants in common or joint tenants, as your intentions could be invalidated.
